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## Fly Fishing in Tanzania

It was a long trip to get there, flying from DC to Dubai (12.5 hours) to Dar es Salaam (5.5 hours) to an airstrip carved out of the bush (2.5 hours), and then by 4WD vehicle to the first camp by the Ruhudji River (1/2 hour). We lived in large safari tents, ate native game, and sat around a campfire above the river at night, swapping stories and listening to the crocs, hippos and tiger fish splashing just below us.</p> <p>After a few days on the Ruhudji, 5 of us traveled by 4WD through the bush (and millions of tsetse flies stirred up by a little rain) to the Mnyera River camp - a more primitive and scenic site. 3 others flew to the Serengeti to see the annual migration. At the Mnyera we ate on the beach, fished the river for a few days, and listened to the elephants that came into camp during the night. They're amazingly quiet until they get into the river and start playing around.</p> <p>After that, we returned the way we came, with the exception that the tsetse flies had dissappeared after the bush dried out. We saw lots of animals on the way back, including a huge Eland buck - apparently they're a rare sight. The baby Warthogs were the funniest - small and cute, and just as ugly as their parents.</p> <p>I'll have more details at the next meeting.</p>
